## **PREPARING FOR A** JUNIOR PROMOTION

#### **Getting Started:**

- 1. Keep all evaluations, letters and emails that speak to the impact of your work.
- 2. Start organizing your work right away! Start a filing system.
- 3. Maintain your CV regularly use the UofT template.
- 4. Create a teaching dossier and maintain it annually.
- 5. Ensure you are being evaluated by learners – and fill out/maintain your teaching data summary table annually.
- 6. Ensure you are in POWER log in
- 7. Identify an academic mentor if possible.
- 8. Speak with your hospital/program administrator for assistance.
- 9. Take advantage of opportunities to disseminate your work - say YES!

# **CRITERIA FOR A** PROMOTION

**#1 Sustained Commitment:** 

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h	<ul> <li>A continuous commitment in one category: teaching effectiveness; education/ curriculum development; Creative Professional Activity; QI; research – IN ADDITION TO:</li> <li>Demonstrated evidence of academic impact + dedication and responsibility to your discipline</li> <li>OR #2 Advanced Degree:</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Completion of a graduate program AFTER your MD – IN ADDITION TO:</li> <li>1-2 first authored peer-reviewed publications</li> </ul>
	WHEN CAN I APPLY FOR A JUNIOR PROMOTION?
	<ul> <li>Generally, the DFCM expects for full time faculty with at least 3 years of appointment; for part time faculty closer to 5 years of appointment; for adjunct faculty closer to 7 or more years of appointment</li> <li>If applying based on advance degree –</li> </ul>
