• DFCM Research Symposium: Ideas to Action on Building Collaboration Across Sites

On November 13, 2025, the Research Program at the Department of Family and Community Medicine (DFCM) hosted Part Two of its Research Symposium, following a successful May event focused on building research capacity and community. This session brought together faculty and funded researchers to strengthen connections and lay the groundwork for collaborative, teambased research initiatives.

The afternoon featured interactive discussions where participants identified priority research areas and worked in breakout groups to shape preliminary research proposals. Five key themes emerged:

- Optimizing primary health care systems
- Integrating Al into primary care
- Advancing equity-focused research (with emphasis on 2S/LGBTQIA+ health)
- Improving primary care clinical guideline development
- Addressing maternal care and pregnancy loss

Additional topics of interest were also identified, ranging from infectious diseases, palliative care, planetary health, patient education and empowerment to substance use.

Through dynamic discussions and collaborative whiteboarding, attendees explored research questions, methodological approaches, knowledge mobilization strategies, and opportunities for future funding. The symposium concluded with clear next steps toward developing team grant proposals that reflect the diverse expertise across DFCM sites.

This initiative underscores DFCM's commitment to fostering innovation and collaboration in primary care research - ensuring that emerging ideas translate into impactful projects for patients, providers, and communities.
