These questions can be part of research (e.g., <u>What is the most effective way to treat acute COVID?</u>), <u>quality</u> improvement efforts to improve care, and can relate to education or policy. With the Department of Family and Community Medicine (DFCM) Research Program team, we are supporting faculty and residents translate their Ideas 2 Proposals (I2P), and will repeat this course annually (intake will happen each fall). A key focus for 2025 is advancing ways to work with the data generated by our work in primary care, and to build a foundation for new AI tools that are emerging to reduce administrative burdens. HIGHLIGHTS

The UPLEARN Director and team members team will soon have completed visits to all 15 hospital sites affiliated with the DFCM. During these visits, we surveyed attendees about their research interests. We identified some of the top research areas of interest from the sites as follows:

- Tools to reduce administrative burden
- How to improve collaboration and coordination of care between specialists and primary care
- How to ensure adherence to the most up-to-date clinical guidelines
- Improving care, access, and health outcomes for equity-deserving populations
- Preventative care (esp. cancer screening, vaccinations)
