HIGHLIGHTS

• Enhancing Patient Engagement in Research

This past June, nine UPLEARN patient partners shared their experience with the UPLEARN Council, highlighting both strengths and areas for improvement in engagement. Their feedback, with the instrumental support of Dana Arafeh (DFCM's Patient and Family Engagement Specialist), led to the creation of a patient engagement improvement plan. In September, UPLEARN hosted its first Patient Partner Debrief Meeting, providing a great opportunity to further explore patients' perspectives on several key areas, including the improvement plan and the UPLEARN Council's Terms of Reference, amplifying patient voices and integrating their insights into strengthening our engagement strategies.

Key enhancements now underway include:

- Onboarding and orientation: clearer communication of roles and expectations.
- Feedback channels: multiple channels to share input and ideas.
- Accessible documentation: creation of shared online folder and acronym list.
- Meeting best practices: dedicated time for patient input, using anchor questions and/or
 polls to guide discussions, and requesting researchers who are presenting projects to
 address patient engagement-related questions and share plain-language project
 summaries in advance.

These enhancements aim to foster more meaningful, inclusive, and impactful patient involvement in research.

Launch of Ideas to Proposal (I2P) 2026 Course

We are pleased to share that the *Ideas to Proposal (I2P)* Course will be launching again from **January 19 to March 23, 2026**. Designed for early-stage investigators, this hybrid course equips participants with the knowledge and tools to transform a primary care research idea into a focused research question and develop it into a competitive proposal. In addition to skill-building, participants will benefit from mentorship, and networking opportunities. Preparation is currently underway, and registration will open soon. New Academic Positions at Oak Valley Health (OVH)

The Research Chairs will be held by experienced investigators with a strong track record in healthcare research, mentorship, and leadership. All positions are three-year terms.

• Call for Applications: 2026 TUTOR-PHC Training Program

Transdisciplinary Understanding and Training on Research – Primary Health Care (TUTOR-PHC) is a pan-Canadian interdisciplinary research capacity-building program that provides mentorship, networking and interdisciplinary team experience to help primary care clinicians, researchers, decision-makers, and learners strengthen their research knowledge and enhance interdisciplinary collaboration, evidence-based decision-making, and leadership skills. This one-year certificate program includes a 4-day in-person symposium and online workshops and forum discussions, with a fee of C\$3,000 (plus applicable taxes). Applications for the 2026 cohort are now open, with a deadline of **December 12, 2025**.
