

Tip sheet for submitting an application for Mainpro+ accreditation through the OCFP/CFPC:

1. Identify CFPC Members for your Scientific Planning Committee:

The number of CFPC member(s) required varies. Provincially delivered programs require 1 active CFPC member, nationally certified programs require 3 members. Ensure that the required number of CFPC members are actively involved in the planning process as they will be asked to confirm this in an email they receive from the CFPC.

2. Preview the Application Process:

• Obtain and **review** a copy of the <u>application form</u> to understand the questions you will need to answer and the documents you will need to upload.

3. Documentation Requirements:

- Gather all necessary documents before starting the formal application.
- Common issues to avoid in document submission:
 - Include details on how the SPC will mitigate bias if there is evidence of a potential conflict of interest.
 - Ensure the speaker invite is in letter template (an example is available on the website)
 - An agenda must be included with session details
 - Evaluation must include the compulsory question regarding bias
 - Certificate of completion must include current approved wording

4. Submit the Application:

• Ensure that all application materials are submitted through the online platform (https://certplus.cfpc.ca) at least six weeks prior to the first anticipated activity delivery date.

5. Reviewer Feedback:

- After submission your application will be reviewed, and reviewers may flag need for additional supporting documents or request further information.
- If you receive feedback, address any requested changes promptly.
