- **Ideas to Proposal (I2P) 2026 Course Off to a Strong Start**

The 2026 I2P course has been well underway since January. Learners are exploring key foundational topics, including literature reviews and library tools, knowledge synthesis and review, and introductory quantitative research.

The first assignment, focused on crafting research questions and preparing a literature review summary, has been submitted and is under review for feedback.
