About Primary Care Networks (PCNs)

Primary Care Networks (PCNs) emerged organically to ensure primary care had a voice within Ontario Health Teams (OHTs). In response, the Ministry of Health and Ontario Health began formalizing PCN structures to support family physician leadership and coordination.

Development has been guided by organizations such as the OMA, SGFP, AFHTO, and the Alliance for Healthier Communities. The Ontario Primary Care Council, a grassroots group of PCN leads across all OHTs, continues to advance this work province-wide.

West Toronto PCN

The West Toronto Primary Care Network (WTPCN) plays a key role within the West Toronto OHT, co-designing local health care delivery with a strong focus on primary care.

It ensures value for primary care providers and their patients, leads engagement efforts, and fosters collaboration.

The WTPCN represents ~250 primary care providers and is built on the **C.A.S.A.** principles.
